First, to those members who are receiving a newsletter for the first time, welcome. Thankyou for caring about an area that is of tremendous local significance enough to become actively involved in its future. It's great to see such an active community spirit.

Second, for our original members, as we have recently celebrated our first anniversary as a group it is now time for those who joined a year ago to renew their membership, you will be notified soon if this applies to you.

The local/state Government is behind our group and recognises the valuable contribution we are making to the cause of local environmental conservation. This recognition has only been won because we are a very active group and because we represent the voice of the community. This requires a healthy database of members and your active participation.

Finally, there is room for some new faces on the committee and we would welcome any contribution members can make to the running of the group. If you would like to help out, please contact Serg Zaccaria or Sarah Tebbutt on the number given above.

What's been happening?

• Announcement of funding by Bracks Government. Due to the hard work of our lobby group and the support of newly-elected Member for Monbulk James Merlino and Craig Smith from the Greens. We have been successful in presenting our case for reservation of the land to the Minister for Conservation and Environment, Sherryl Garbutt. The response has been overwhelmingly positive, with the recent announcement that the Bracks Government will match the \$50,000 contribution by the Shire of Yarra Ranges for the development of a management plan and the first stage of its implementation, and set up a Committee of Management. The Committee of Management will be formed immediately, made up of representatives from the community, the Shire of Yarra

Ranges and the Department of Natural Resources and the Environment. The land will be classified at the recommendation of the Committee of Management. If the recommendation is that the land be reserve land, it will be reserved. This is an enormous achievement by our group – thank you once again to all members and supporters for your help in making this happen.

- First meeting of Committee of Management. Tuesday 17th December saw the
 first meeting of the newly-formed Committee of Management. In attendance
 were Serg Zaccaria, President of Friends of Glen Fern Valley Bushlands, and
 representatives from the Shire of Yarra Ranges and the Department of Natural
 Resources and the Environment. This initial meeting was to set in place the
 groundwork for future works and funding, more news will passed on as it
 comes to hand.
- Working bees. Every 3rd Sunday of the month Members, Committee and interested supporters meet on-site to take part in a working bee.
 To date about 7 acres of weeds are under control and natural regeneration is occurring. It is amazing to see what a small group of people can achieve in such a short period of time. The work on the site will be on going for many years and as the saying goes "many hands make light work".
 Next year we hope to start to carry out revegetation work, so those of you who love to plant, your time is coming soon.
 So please try to make the time in the coming year to attend a working bee, whether a few or all of them.
- Flora and Fauna Surveys. Our Fauna and Flora groups have also been regularly carrying out vital survey work. With the coming of the warmer weather we have sightings of 60 or more bird species each month with new species being added all the time.
- Committee meetings. The committee meets once a month and we welcome the attendance of Members. Please contact us using the details above if you'd like to attend.

Wonderful Weeds #1 Agapanthus



Agapanthus praecox ssp orientalis

Origin/Description

South Africa

Evergreen herb in leafy clumps to 60cm, flower heads to 120cm. Thick rhizome. Flowers Nov-Feb, mauve or white. Leaves and rhyzomes poisonous. Reproduces By seed and vegetatively (rhizome growth or fragments). Spreads in dumped garden waste and contaminated soil.

Control Methods

- 1. Remove flower heads prior to flower.
- 2. Dig out leaves and rhyzomes and dispose in garbage (does not compost well). Roots do not regenerate.

Spraying glysophate herbicide has little or no effect on plant
